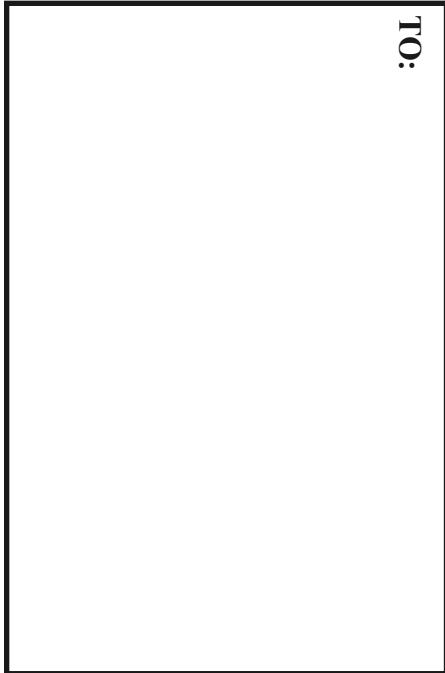

WINNERS

Amateur-Owner-Handler Class (effective as of 1/1/2009)

Chapter 3, Section 7 - The Amateur-Owner-Handler Class shall be for dogs that are at least six months of age that are not champions. Dogs must be handled in the class by the registered owner of the dog. This class is restricted to exhibitors who have not, at any point in time, been a professional dog handler, AKC approved conformation judge, or employed as an assistant to a professional handler. Additionally, members of the immediate family or household of a current professional handler are ineligible for this class (as defined in Chapter 11, Section 13).

*** Effective 9/02 – All dogs entered in the BBE class must be **individually** registered with the AKC. The person handling the dog must be a breeder of record of the dog and an owner of record of the dog. To exhibit in this class, family members must be a breeder and owner of record.*

NON-REGULAR CLASSES INVOLVING SINGLE-DOG ENTRIES:

Winners of these classes are eligible for Best of Breed, unless they have been defeated in another class.

BEST OF BREED COMPETITION

At the Judge's discretion, up to 3 Awards of Merit will be awarded at this show.

BEST IN PUPPY CLASSES

Best Puppy will be selected from the Puppy Class winners following the judging of Best of Breed Competition. If Winners Dog or Winners Bitch is chosen from a Puppy Class, it is automatically Best Puppy of its sex. If Winners Dog or Winners Bitch is not selected from a Puppy Class and Reserve Winners Dog or Reserve Winners Bitch is selected from a Puppy Class, then Reserve Winners Dog or Reserve Winners Bitch is automatically Best Puppy of its sex. If Best of Winners or Best of Breed is from a Puppy Class it is automatically the Best in Puppy Classes.

BEST IN BRED-BY-EXHIBITOR CLASSES

Bred by Exhibitor Dog class 1st and Bred by Exhibitor Bitch class 1st will compete for Best Bred By Exhibitor following the Best Puppy competition. If Best of Winners or Best of Breed is from the Bred by Exhibitor class, it is automatically the Best Bred by Exhibitor.

**NON-REGULAR CLASSES INVOLVING
MULTIPLE-DOG ENTRIES:**

STUD DOG CLASS – For Stud Dogs and a minimum of two of their Get. Stud Dogs must be entered in the Stud Dog Class and must be shown in the ring with their Get. The owner of the Stud Dog need not necessarily be owner of the Get. While the merits of the Stud Dog are not to be considered in the placement of the entry, the Stud Dog must be examined to determine if it has a condition that would require its disqualification or excusal under the Dog Show Rules, AKC Policy, or the standard for the breed. Get must be entered in a Regular Class, Best of Breed Competition, or some other non-Regular Class. There is no fee for Stud Dog if entered as an additional class, \$20.00 if entered in Stud Dog Class Only. As the judge's decision in this class is based on the merits of more than one dog, no one of the dogs making up the entry judged First in the class will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed by virtue of having won this class.

BROOD BITCH CLASS: Same as Stud Dog class except substitute Brood Bitch for Stud Dog and Produce for Get.

BRACE CLASS – Two Dogs of Identical Ownership. If Brace Class is an additional entry for each dog, there is no fee. Otherwise, Dogs may be entered for Brace Class competition only for a fee of \$27. per brace. Each Dog competing in the Brace Class must be so noted on Entry Form under additional Classes. As the Judge's decision in this class is based on the merits of more than one dog, no one of the dogs making up the entry judged First in the class will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed by virtue of having won this class.

OPEN JUNIOR CLASS: For Boys and Girls who are at least 10 years and under 14 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have won three First Places, with Competition present, in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

OPEN SENIOR CLASS: For Boys and Girls who are at least 14 years and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have won three First Places, with Competition present, in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

IT IS DISTINCTLY UNDERSTOOD THAT EVERY DOG AT THESE EVENTS IS IN THE CARE, CUSTODY AND CONTROL OF HIS OWNER OR HANDLER DURING THE ENTIRE TIME THE DOG IS ON THE SHOW PREMISES.
2. The club may decline any entries for cause and may refuse to receive or may remove any dog on account of disease, viciousness or other cause and no one shall have any claim or recourse against the club or any official thereof.
3. No space will be provided for unentered dogs.
4. All claims for trophies and other prizes must be made in the ring before the completion of the judging of the breed and the superintendent advised at once in the event of any discrepancy.
5. The welfare of an exhibitor's child is assumed to be the responsibility of the exhibitor. It is distinctly understood that exhibitors will exercise control and restraint over their children at these events.
6. No grooming tables, exercise pens, or canopies will be allowed in the aisles, and all grooming must be done in areas specified by the club.
7. Due to the increased number of crates and grooming tables, chairs will not be allowed in the handlers section.
8. Private exercise pens will not be allowed.
9. No Camper Hook-ups.
10. DO NOT LEAVE DOGS IN CLOSED VEHICLES.
11. NO SMOKING UNDER THE TENTS.

ROUTES TO THE EVENT SITE FOLLOW BLUE SIGNS FOR “BEACH AREA”

FROM RTE. 95 - EXIT #16 EAST NORWALK, CT – Go South on East Ave. (½ mile). Left (Van Zandt, Rte. 136) then right (Gregory) for ½ mile. Left on Marvin, immediate right onto Calf Pasture Beach Blvd. (½ mile). Left (Canfield Ave.) to exhibitor entrance.

FDR PARK TO E. NORWALK, CT – Best Route to avoid I-95 traffic. 30 miles back roads, 40 minutes travel time. Rte. 202 South to Rte. 35 East. At Ridgefield, CT turn right at fountain, (Rte. 33) South to light at Rte. 7. Turn right, South on Rte. 7 (becomes Main Ave., Norwalk) for approximately 4 miles. Turn right at light past Starbucks (on right). Follow Rte. 7 Connector to I-95 (Exit #15) go North one exit to Exit #16 proceed as above.

FROM MERRITT PARKWAY & RTE. 7 – Exit 39, take Rte. 7 South to Rte. 95 North one Exit. Exit #16 turn South (East Ave.) proceed as above.

Telegraph, Telephone, and unsigned entries cannot be accepted. Entries not on Official AKC Entry Forms and photocopies of entry forms without Agreement and Rules on the reverse side of the Official AKC Entry Form are NOT ACCEPTABLE.

Mail all entries and fees to Ms. Cathy Hill, 44-33 244th Street, Douglaston, NY 11363.

Entries received without fees will not be accepted. Acknowledgement of entries will be made as soon as practicable with tickets and/or identification cards. The person accompanying a dog must show tickets of admission and identification before the dog will be received. Should such acknowledgement not be received by the exhibitor within a reasonable time, please notify the Show Secretary.

Make all Checks and Money Orders payable to the English Setter Club of New England, Inc. CANADIAN exhibitors must make fees payable in U.S. funds. Please mail checks or money orders with entries. Show Secretary assumes no responsibility for cash sent through the mail.

A \$3.00 AKC Event Service Fee and a Recording Fee of \$.50 will be required for each dog entered at any Licensed or Member Club Show, Obedience Trial or Tracking Test. This Recording Fee is to be collected by the Show-giving Club and paid to the American Kennel Club. If a dog is entered in more than one class in the show, the Recording Fee is to be collected on the first entry only (American Kennel Club Rule, Chapter 11, Section 2).

ENTRY FORM changes, additions, corrections and cancellations MUST be received in writing prior to the closing of entries, and MUST INCLUDE AKC NUMBER. Those received by telephone are NOT acceptable. No Entry shall be made and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance.

Entry Fees shall not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee. If because of riots, civil disturbances or other acts beyond the control of the management, it is impossible to open or to complete the show, no refund of entry fee will be made.

Returned Checks do not constitute a valid entry fee. The Show Secretary will add a collection fee to the amount of each returned check. Subsequent returned checks from the same exhibitors may result in their being put on a CASH ONLY basis.

No Refund for Duplicate Entries. Every effort to find all duplicate entries will be made; however, if entry has been processed, no refund will be made.

Errors on Entry Blanks. Owners are responsible for errors in making out entry forms, whoever may make such errors, and no entry fee will be refunded in event of such errors or cancellation of entries after the published closing date.

Dogs May Arrive at any time prior to their scheduled time of judging. Dogs not required for further judging will be excused. Judges Will Not Wait for Any Dog Holding Up a Class. Owners or agents alone are responsible for the presence of their dogs in judging ring when their classes are called to be judged. All Dogs Present must be held on leash or confined to their crates except when being judged or when in the exercising ring.

Class Cash Prizes will be paid in the ring to the person showing the dog. Claims for prize money must be made in the ring before the judging of that breed is over, and the Show Secretary's Office advised at once. The Show Secretary and Show-giving Club disclaim any liability for cash prizes after the judging of the breed is over.

THE SHOW-GIVING CLUB, the Show Secretary, their Agents, employees, etc. assume no responsibility for any loss, damage, or injury sustained by the exhibitors, handlers, or to any of the dogs or property, and further assume no responsibility for injury to children not under the control of their

AKC Code of Sportsmanship

PREFACE: The sport of purebred dog competitive events dates prior to 1884, the year of AKC's birth. Shared values of those involved in the sport include principles of sportsmanship. They are practiced in all sectors of our sport: conformation, performance and companion. Many believe that these principles of sportsmanship are the prime reason why our sport has thrived for over one hundred years. With the belief that it is useful to periodically articulate the fundamentals of our sport, this code is presented.

- Sportsmen respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen commit themselves to values of fair play, honesty, courtesy, and vigorous competition, as well as winning and losing with grace.
- Sportsmen refuse to compromise their commitment and obligation to the sport of purebred dogs by injecting personal advantage or consideration into their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- The sportsman respects the AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are not inconsistent and are able to appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.
- Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport.
- Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.
- Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
