Directions:

Rte 8 North or South, take exit 55, Pinewoods Rd. East on Pinewoods to Torringford St. Left (north) on Torringford for .4 mile to West Hill Rd.

Right on West Hill for 1.8 miles.

Brodie Park is on the left.

From the East, I-84 to Farmington, Rte 4 West for 13 miles toward Collinsville. Straight onto Rte 179 for 3.8 miles. Left on Rte 44 West for 4.4 miles into New Hartford center. Left onto Rte 219 South for 1 mile.

Right on West Hill Road for 2.6 miles. Brodie Park is on the right.

More information on this year's Setter Symposium activities:

Greetings everyone! This year's Symposium is brought to you by the English Setter Club of New England, the TarTan Gordon Setter Club, and the Irish Red and White Setter Association of America. ALL Setters are invited and encouraged to attend! It is ALL FUN! Here is a basic run-down of the offerings:

Obedience:

Working with an instructor, you will warm up with some straight-line heeling. How much connection do you have with your dog?

We'll try to give you the confidence to give it a try at a trial.

Intro to clicker training. We'll work with you and your dog to get their attention and mark that behavior.

When to mark is important whether it's with a clicker or voice "yes".

We will have a Beginner Novice course for you to try, and talk about what other venues you can do - on leash.

We will talk about the new AKC title FETCH - Setters love it. Remember that our dogs are very smart and we need to

be creative in our training methods. You cannot drill a setter; they will shut down. Play is just as important as training, Be the "fun one" in your dog's life. Set them up for success when training.

Rally

Also with an instructor, we will set up a Novice Course to try. See for yourself how great novice is: you can talk to your dog, slap your leg to get their attention, take the mystery away from what the signs mean. It's all on leash, so there is no stress involved. Find out that Intermediate Rally is on leash as well! We will have some additional signs out to show how easy they are to read and perform.

Canine Good Citizen and Trick Dog

Pre-registration is required. This is an actual test, and if you pass, you will get a title!! Have your dog's registration information with you.

Breed Handling

Morning session is aimed at novices, those who yearn to learn! Bring a show lead if possible. We will talk about stacking, gaiting, patterns, and other handling skills,

Afternoon session is for those who have made the leap into the ring and need to polish their skills, learn tricks of the trade, and how to best present your dog.

Grooming

You will be shown by an experienced setter groomer the right way to sculpt your dog into its best self. Each dog is different, and each type of setter is unique. Learn about the right tools and how to use them correctly. Learn how to accentuate your dog's best features and how to minimize the not-so-good ones.

Bird Work

The basics of what a setter's job is will be discussed. There will be live quail which will be "planted," and your dog will be encouraged to find them by scent and point them. No blank guns will be fired, and your dog will be on a check cord (long lead) at all times. Lots of praise and encouragement.

And we can't forget lunch!!!! One of the best potlucks around!!!!
